Credit Union Service Network Expands Services in Idaho and Colorado By Adding Five Credit Unions and Twelve Locations to Shared Branching

Arvada, Colorado (May 4, 2006) – In April 2006, Credit Union Service Network (CUSN) added five credit unions and twelve shared branching locations to their network. Three of the five credit unions and eleven of the twelve locations are located in Idaho, and two credit unions are located in the Denver, Colorado area. With the addition of these credit unions and branches as Service Centers, these credit unions will be able to better serve members by providing broader access to financial services.

Rocky Mountain Law Enforcement Federal Credit Union located in Denver, Colorado joined the network on April 17, 2006 providing their members access to shared branching. The four credit unions that joined shared branching to benefit their members and open their doors to guest members are Aurora Catholic Federal Credit Union in Aurora, Colorado (one location) on April 19, 2006; Pioneer Federal Credit Union in Mountain Home, Idaho (eight locations) on April 18, 2006; Latah Federal Credit Union in Moscow, ID (two locations) on April 25, 2006; and Clearwater Credit Union, Lewiston, Idaho (one location) on April 26, 2006. Anita Twitchell, president/CEO of Pioneer Federal Credit Union commented "joining CUSN is a real member service and a unique way for credit unions to cooperate." Shared branching enables credit union members to conduct financial transactions at more convenient locations by opening the doors of other credit unions to them. Through Shared Branching, credit union members have access to more than 2,100 Service Centers nationwide, including some foreign locations. Members can conduct the services they most frequently use, including deposits, withdrawals, funds transfers, loan payments and balance inquiries at Shared Branching Service Centers.

Since 1992, CU Service Network has successfully implemented shared branching for over 60 credit unions in Colorado, Nebraska, New Mexico, Idaho, and Wyoming. CUSN was established to help participating credit unions reach more members in areas outside of their office radius. Credit unions own the network and have a volunteer board to govern the direction of the organization.
