Credit Union Service Network Adds Two Credit Unions and Eleven Locations to Shared Branching

Arvada, Colorado (March 29, 2006) – In March 2006, Credit Union Service Network (CUSN) added two credit unions and eleven shared branching locations throughout Colorado, Wyoming, and Nebraska, to their network. With the addition of these credit unions and branches as Service Centers, these credit unions will be able to better serve members by providing broader access to financial services. The two credit unions that joined shared branching for the benefit of their members and guest members are UniWyo Federal Credit Union in Laramie, Wyoming (one location) and Metrum Community Credit Union in Centennial, Colorado (two locations). Also opening service centers were, Warren Federal Credit Union, Cheyenne, Wyoming (three locations); U of C Federal Credit Union, Boulder, Colorado (new location in Longmont, Colorado); Omaha Police Federal Credit Union, Omaha, Nebraska (two locations in the Omaha area); and New Horizons Community Credit Union, Denver, Colorado (two locations in the Denver area). Shared branching enables credit union members to conduct financial transactions at more convenient locations by opening the doors of other credit unions to them. Through Shared Branching, credit union members have access to more than 2,000 Service Centers through over 1,200 credit unions, including some foreign locations. Members can conduct the services they most frequently use, including deposits, withdrawals, funds transfers, loan payments and balance inquiries at Shared Branching Service Centers.

Doug Burke, president of CUSN notes that, "With the addition of these two new credit unions and eleven shared branching locations, we are building a road to success for the many

credit unions and their members that participate in shared branching by providing added service.”

About CUSN

Since 1992, CU Service Network has successfully implemented shared branching for over 60 credit unions in Colorado, Nebraska, New Mexico, Idaho, and Wyoming. CUSN was established to help participating credit unions reach more members in areas outside of their office radius.
