Omaha Police Federal Credit Union Opens Two Locations as Shared Branching Service Centers

Omaha, Nebraska (March 28, 2006) – Omaha Police Federal Credit Union recently opened two new Credit Union Service Network (CUSN) Shared Branching locations in the Omaha area. The CUSN Shared Branching network allows credit union members to access banking services across the nation. With Omaha Police FCU adding its two branches as Service Centers, the credit union will be able to better serve members by providing broader access to financial services in Nebraska. The two new Service Centers are located at 3003 South 82nd Avenue, Omaha, Nebraska and 923 Galvin Road South, Suite 109-110, Bellevue, Nebraska.

“Omaha Police FCU has been a member of the Shared Branching network since 2005. We were the first credit union in the Omaha area to offer shared branching for our members, and now are the first to serve guest members,” said Mary Johnson, President of Omaha Police Federal Credit Union. “Providing superior service and account access to our members and guest members by adding these two locations to the Shared Branching network is key to advancing the credit union philosophy of people helping people.”

Shared branching enables credit union members to conduct financial transactions at more convenient locations by opening the doors of other credit unions to them. Through Shared Branching, credit union members have access to more than 2,000 Service Centers through over 1,200 credit unions, including some foreign locations. Members can conduct the services they most frequently use, including deposits, withdrawals, funds transfers, loan payments, advances and balance inquiries at Shared Branching Service Centers.

Doug Burke, president of CUSN adds, “With the addition of two new Omaha Police Federal Credit Union locations to our network, we are able to enhance our mission of providing added service to the many credit unions and their members that participate in shared branching.”

About CUSN

Since 1992, CU Service Network has successfully implemented shared branching for over 60 credit unions in Colorado, Nebraska, New Mexico, Idaho, and Wyoming. CUSN was established to help participating credit unions reach more members in areas outside of their office radius. Credit unions own the network and have a volunteer board to govern the direction of the organization.
