### **Credit Union Service Network Elects New Board Members**

**LAKESWOOD, CO** (May 9, 2008)—Credit Union Service Network (CUSN) held its annual meeting at the Table Mountain Inn, Golden, Colorado on May 8, 2008. With over 37 member credit unions in attendance and 64 attendees present, the Board of Directors election results were announced. Bob Hoefler, President/CEO of Dupaco Community Credit Union and Keith M. Cowling, President/CEO, Credit Union of Denver, both incumbents, were re-elected for a 3-year term.

Stephanie Teubner, President/CEO of Warren Federal Credit Union in Cheyenne, Wyoming and Mark Uden, President/CEO of Mutual 1<sup>st</sup> Credit Union in Omaha, Nebraska were appointed as the newest members of the CUSN Board of Directors.

Stephanie Teubner has worked in the financial services industry for 18 years, specifically for credit unions for the past 13 years. From 1995 to 2000, Ms. Teubner was CEO of Energy West Federal Credit Union in Casper, Wyoming. She joined the Executive Leadership Team of Warren Federal Credit Union in 2004 before being promoted to the position of President/CEO. Other professional affiliations include CO-OP Network Advisory Board, Chairman of the Greater Cheyenne Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors, Board of Directors for the Wyoming Credit Union League, Board of Directors for the Douglas Area Chamber of Commerce, Board of Directors for Members Trust Company of Colorado, Board of Directors for Centennial Lending LLC, Board of Directors for Tri-Cue Inc., and Board of Directors for the Credit Union Association of Wyoming. Ms. Teubner graduated from the University of Wyoming with a BS in Business Management; emphasis in Finance. She was elected to a three year term.

Mark Uden has been President/CEO of Mutual 1<sup>st</sup> Federal Credit Union in Omaha, Nebraska since 1988. During Mr. Uden's role as President, Mutual 1<sup>st</sup> joined CU Service Network as an issuer and acquirer in 2007; transitioned from an occupational to community charter in 2004, as well as established several other products and services for the credit union. Prior to working with Mutual 1<sup>st</sup>, he was the Compensation and Organization Supervisor for Mutual of Omaha Insurance Company, and Admissions Counselor at Midland Lutheran College in Fremont, Nebraska. Currently Mr. Uden serves as the Director of the Nebraska Credit Union League Board, Trustee of the Mid-America Council for the Boy Scouts of America, Member of the Finance Committee of Holy Cross Lutheran Church, President/Treasurer of the Altech Business Park Association Board, Director of the University of Nebraska Gymnastics Booster Club Board, and is a member of the Alumni Board at Midland Lutheran College. Previously, he served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Nebraska Credit Union League, Chairman of the Board of Directors for Members Only EZ Leasing, Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors for Innovative Technology, Inc., as well as Vice President of the Church Council at Holy Cross Lutheran Church. Mr. Uden graduated from Midland Lutheran College in Fremont, Nebraska with a BA in Behavioral Science and Religion. He was elected to a one year term.

The Board also voted Carla Hedrick, President/CEO of Denver Community FCU as Chairman; Keith Cowling, President/CEO of Credit Union of Denver as Vice Chair; and C. Michael Litzau, Executive VP Corporate of Sooper CU as Secretary/Treasurer.
