Credit Union Service Network Extending Its Reach in Colorado and Iowa.

LAKESWOOD, CO (February 29, 2008)—Credit Union Service Network (CUSN) proudly announces several new credit unions and locations to shared branching.

In Colorado, Air Academy FCU joined shared branching, offering its membership the convenience of over 3120 locations nationwide; additionally they opened all twelve of their branches as an acquiring or “host” credit union. The twelve new service centers are located in Highlands Ranch, Parker, Elizabeth, Castle Rock, Monument, Fountain, and Colorado Springs. Credit union members that are part of the shared branching network may immediately begin using these new locations.

Members Federal Credit Union in Aurora, Colorado and Elevations Credit Union in Boulder, Colorado have been operating with shared branching for several years and continue to see the benefits for their members. Each credit union opened a new branch in February and immediately added shared branching providing guest members with even more choices of where they can conduct their business. “We are pleased that many of our participating credit unions continue to open additional branches and offer shared branching services as they see the value not only to their credit union, but to the entire credit union movement”, said Doug Burke, President, CU Service Network.

In Iowa, First Class Credit Union has joined shared branching and opened all three of its branches as an acquiring credit union to serve members of other credit unions. Two service centers are located in Des Moines and one is located in Sioux City. All credit union members that are part of the shared branching network have access to these three new locations in Iowa.

In an effort to better serve their membership, Capitol View Credit Union has joined shared branching as an issuer, meaning their membership can use any CU Service Center nationwide.

Shared branching enables credit union members to conduct financial transactions at more convenient locations by opening the doors of other credit unions to them. Through Shared Branching, credit union members have access to more than 3,120 Service Centers nationwide, including some foreign locations. Members can conduct the services they most frequently use, including deposits, withdrawals, funds transfers, loan payments and balance inquiries at Shared Branching Service Centers.
